#### Call to Order

Mr. Wilson called the Planning Session to order at 7:30 p.m.

#### Amend and/or Adopt Agenda

Mr. Bramer made a motion to adopt the agenda as presented. Mr. Bemiss seconded; the vote was unanimous.

#### Superintendent's Reports

Dr. Knott introduced Mr. Steve Telfer, Executive Director and Mr. Chris Trader, Business Manager with the Madison Area Educational Special Services Unit. They discussed the Cooperative with Board Members. The Coop was established in 1968 and works by sending staff to students. They provide numerous shared services. The Coop is currently made up of four school districts and oversees all operations of Special Education programs to make sure they are in compliance with the law. The budget is developed and approved by the Board of Directors, which are the Superintendents of all the member corporations. Mr. Bramer commended the Coop on their current agreement which is still in effect from 1988. The Coop will require notification by April 2017 if CCSC wishes to join.

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Dr. Knott updated the Board on employee insurance. She said there had been a meeting recently and it appears that CCSC will have to think about going to a high deductible plan next year due to the increase. She said Anthem will remain the provider. The increase is expected to be 11-19% depending on what is decided. She said CCSC won't be able to be self-insured yet.

Dr. Knott also discussed the contract with Go Solutions. She says it is up for renewal and the cost is the same as last year.

Board Members: Mr. Bramer thanked everyone for working out the details to have his last four meetings at Renaissance Academy. Mr. Bemiss said the more traffic in Renaissance Academy the better. He also encouraged everyone to vote.

## **Updates to NEOLA Board Policy**

Dr. Knott asked Board Members if the information sheet on the policy updates was helpful and if they would be ready to vote next week.

#### TBR Change

Dr. Knott discussed some changes to Textbook Rental. She noted there were a few errors discovered and there will be some refunds. She also noted that TBR hasn't been this detailed before and changes are expected due to added internal controls at the building level.

## **Addition of CHS Club**

Dr. Knott introduced Mr. Jason Carter, CCSC Athletic Director. Mr. Carter discussed forming a bowling club at Clarksville High School. He said the Indiana State Bowling Association wants to sign up CCSC and surrounding schools for a new conference. Mr. Carter said he already has enough players for a team and expects more students would be interested. He noted the Athletic Department would pay for the first year's fees but thought the money would get paid back by fundraising and possibly hosting a tournament. Mr. Carter said Mr. Andy Luther, CES Teacher, is interested in being the coach. That is a volunteer position. Mr. Bemiss said he appreciated the research done on the club.
