Reports of School and Organization Representatives

Superintendent's Reports: Superintendent Bennett discussed the results of the ISTEP tests. She noted that while there is some growth, there are many areas of work needed. She said school grades are still embargoed. She updated the Board on the upcoming LifeSpring Community Health Fair at Clarksville Middle School. Superintendent Bennett said she had met with the Superintendent of Clarksville Parks and Recreation. She said CCSC will get a full page ad in their program guides, which are mailed to 9500 homes. She noted 60% of those homes are out of the CCSC district. Superintendent Bennett said new pop up banners made at S.K. Signs will be used to promote CCSC at upcoming community events. She said that the banners will be ready in time for the One Southern Indiana career and job fair. She noted that it was important for CCSC to have a presence there.
