Logging in to the App

The Campus Student and Campus Parent apps provide the same tools as the browser version, with the benefit of the option to Stay Logged In and receive push notifications.

1. Download the app from the App Store or Google Play.

2. Search for your District Name and State, entering at least three characters of your district's name to search. Select your district from the list.

3. Enter your Username and Password, provided by your school.

4. If using a secure, private device, mark Stay Logged In to receive mobile push notifications, if enabled by your school.

5. Click Log In!



- 6. Enter a Username and Password and click Login



How do I get Notifications?

Notifications are available through the Campus Student and Campus Parent mobile apps. You may need to enable notifications on your device as well, in addition to the app settings.

1. Before you log in, mark Stay Logged In to receive notifications.

2. After logging in, click the user menu in the top right and then click Settings and Notification Settings.

3. From there, indicate which types of notifications you would like to receive and set the threshold for notifications. For example, indicate if you only want to receive Assignment notifications if the score is below 70%.

4. Click Save.

For students without internet or cellular connection, datacasting may be an option. PBS stations across the state are sending out data through their broadcasts that may be received by equipment in a student's home. This service currently connects to LMS systems such as Canvas and Google Classroom to automatically send assignments to the student's home. Learn more about the datacasting program <u>here.</u>

There are several internet access points on our campus, including the Renaissance Academy parking lot and the parking lot between Clarksville High School and Clarksville Elementary School.



COMMUNITY ELIGIBILTY PROVISION

Clarksville Community Schools will continue to participate in the national school lunch and breakfast program called the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for the 2023-24 school year. Through the CEP, all students will receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school <u>at no charge</u> to the student. A la carte food purchases and additional meals are not included in this program and will incur a charge. When a student's account has a negative balance, no charges will be allowed for a la carte items.

HepB: The minimum age for the 3rd dose of Hepatitis B is 24 weeks of age.

DTaP: 4 doses of DTaP/DTP/DT are acceptable if 4th dose was administrated on or after child's 4th birthday.

Polio*: 3 doses of Polio are acceptable for all grade levels if the 3rd dose was given on or after the 4th birthday and at least 6 months after the previous dose.

*For students in grades K-10, the final dose must be administered on or after the 4th birthday and be administered at least 6 months after the previous dose.

Varicella: Physician documentation of disease history, including month and year, is proof of immunity for children entering preschool through 12th grade. Parent report of disease history is not acceptable.

Tdap: There is no minimum interval from the last Td dose.

MCV4: Individuals who receive dose 1 on or after their 16th birthday only need 1 dose of MCV4.

Hepatitis A: The minimum interval between 1st and 2nd dose is 6 calendar months. 2 doses are required for all grades Pre-K through 12.

COVID-19: COVID-19 vaccine is recommended for all students five years of age and older per CDC and FDA's Emergency Use Authorization.

MEDICATIONS

TRANSPORTING MEDICATIONS

- Parent or guardian must sign medication consent form in advance.
- Must have the M.D. prescription label on the container.
- Original and most up-to-date container.

OVER THE COUNTER MEDICATIONS

- Must be in original container.
- Must have dosing information on package.
- Must be age appropriate (i.e., not adult Tylenol for a child).
- Parent or guardian must sign consent for school to administer.
- To carry medications at school (High School Only), the student must have:
 - Written documentation from M.D. of the medical condition and validation that student understands medicine use and misuse.
 - $\circ~$ Medication consent form signed by parent or guardian.

TRANSPORTING MEDICATIONS

For grades K-8: A parent or guardian must transport medications to/from school **For grades 9-12:** Students may transport their own medications with signed parental consent.
