### Registration



Families with students who are currently enrolled and planning to attend a CCSC school next year should log in to their <u>Campus Portal account</u> to online registration. Select "more" from the drop down box on the left and select "online registration". If you have a new student (grades KG-12) to enroll for next year, you will add that student to the application with your existing students on the "Student" tab in the application.

If you are a returning family who needs to register a new student for the current school year, you should log in to the <u>Campus Portal</u> and add that student using the "New Student Registration" button in Online Registration. Be sure that you choose the appropriate school year from the drop-down box.

If you do not have a Campus Portal account, contact your school to get your Activation Key. If you have forgotten your username or password, use the links on the Campus Portal login page to recover that information. If you need assistance after that, call the school.

### **New Family Registration**





You should pre-register your student (grades KG-12) via our online registration system prior to your appointment. Be sure to select the correct year in the "Registration Year" box. If you are the parent of an incoming Kindergarten student, you can find more information <u>here</u>.

Only one application needs to be completed per family. Once your application has been submitted, please contact the appropriate school(s) for next steps. For a smooth registration process, please gather all necessary paperwork- including child's birth certificate, immunization records, proof of residency and special scheduling documentation (IEPs, 504 plans, etc.).

#### Logging in to the App

The Campus Student and Campus Parent apps provide the same tools as the browser version, with the benefit of the option to Stay Logged In and receive push notifications.

1. Download the app from the App Store or Google Play.

2. Search for your District Name and State, entering at least three characters of your district's name to search. Select your district from the list.

3. Enter your Username and Password, provided by your school.

4. If using a secure, private device, mark Stay Logged In to receive mobile push notifications, if enabled by your school.

5. Click Log In!

#### Logging in from a Web Browser



- 3. Click Parent/Student and then click Campus Parent.
- 4. Click New User?
- 5. Enter your Activation Key (exactly as it appears, including the Dashes) in the space provided and then click **Submit**
- 6. Enter a Username and Password and click Login



#### How do I get Notifications?

Notifications are available through the Campus Student and Campus Parent mobile apps. You may need to enable notifications on your device as well, in addition to the app settings.

1. Before you log in, mark Stay Logged In to receive notifications.

2. After logging in, click the user menu in the top right and then click Settings and Notification Settings.

3. From there, indicate which types of notifications you would like to receive and set the threshold for notifications. For example, indicate if you only want to receive Assignment notifications if the score is below 70%.

4. Click Save.

#### **Supported Devices**

To use the Campus Student or Campus Parent apps, mobile devices must be on an Android version of 4.4 or later and iOS devices must be on a version of 9.0 or later.

#### FAMILY ASSISTANCE APPLICATIONS

At Clarksville Community Schools we strive to provide access and resources that benefit all students. Although meals and curricular materials are free this year, we HIGHLY encourage families to still fill out the assistance application on Infinite Campus. Completing this application ensures the district receives all eligible funding to support students. Families who feel they qualify based on the income eligibility chart below should apply.

Filling out the assistance application when it becomes available may also qualify households to be eligible for the INSunbucks Summer EBT card issued to students in the month of June that comes with \$120 for each household student. 


#### COMMUNITY ELIGIBILTY PROVISION




### <u>Physicals:</u>

**HepB:** The minimum age for the 3rd dose of Hepatitis B is 24 weeks of age.

**DTaP:** 4 doses of DTaP/DTP/DT are acceptable if 4th dose was administrated on or after child's 4th birthday.

**Polio\*:** 3 doses of Polio are acceptable for all grade levels if the 3rd dose was given on or after the 4th birthday and at least 6 months after the previous dose.

\*For students in grades K-10, the final dose must be administered on or after the 4th birthday and be administered at least 6 months after the previous dose.

**Varicella:** Physician documentation of disease history, including month and year, is proof of immunity for children entering preschool through 12th grade. Parent report of disease history is not acceptable.

**Tdap:** There is no minimum interval from the last Td dose.

**MCV4:** Individuals who receive dose 1 on or after their 16th birthday only need 1 dose of MCV4.

**Hepatitis A:** The minimum interval between 1st and 2nd dose is 6 calendar months. 2 doses are required for all grades Pre-K through 12.

**COVID-19:** COVID-19 vaccine is recommended for all students five years of age and older per CDC and FDA's Emergency Use Authorization.

#### TRANSPORTING MEDICATIONS

- Parent or guardian must sign medication consent form in advance.
- Must have the M.D. prescription label on the container.
- Original and most up-to-date container.

#### **OVER THE COUNTER MEDICATIONS**

- Must be in original container.
- Must have dosing information on package.
- Must be age appropriate (i.e., not adult Tylenol for a child).
- Parent or guardian must sign consent for school to administer.
- To carry medications at school (High School Only), the student must have:
  - Written documentation from M.D. of the medical condition and validation that student understands medicine use and misuse.
  - $\circ~$  Medication consent form signed by parent or guardian.

#### **TRANSPORTING MEDICATIONS**

**For grades K-8:** A parent or guardian must transport medications to/from school **For grades 9-12:** Students may transport their own medications with signed parental consent.


